



Let's learn new words!

- larvae or tadpoles: The babies of amphibians. They usually have tails and live in water.
- lizard-like: similar to lizards
- paddle-like: shaped like a paddle (wide and flat)
- webbed feet: In webbed feet, the toes are connected by skin, like a duck's feet.

What is an <u>amphibian</u>?

An amphibian is an animal that can live both on land and in water. They can breathe and take in water through the skin. They lay eggs in water.

Types of Amphibians

FROGS and **TOADS**

Most frogs and toads lay eggs in the water. The babies are called larvae or tadpoles.



Frogs have smooth, shiny skin. Toads have rough, bumpy skin.





SALAMANDERS and NEWTS

Salamanders are lizard-like amphibians with long bodies and tails.



paddle-like tails and webbed feet used for swimming underwater.

Types of Amphibians



Caecilians look like worms or snakes. They live under the ground.

They have no legs. They have tiny eyes, and they have rings around their bodies.

Many caecilians wrap around their eggs to protect them.
