What are **phrasal verbs**?

Phrasal verbs work the same way as **verbs** (action words): They show actions.
They are made of 2 or more words.



verb (action word)
+ preposition
(in, on, off, up...)

Let's learn about phrasal verbs
that talk about CLOTHING!



put on – to cover a part of the body with clothes or shoes

- ✓ Put your hat on—we're going out.
- ✓ He put on his jacket.



take off – to remove clothes (opposite of “put on”)

- ✓ I took off my jacket.
- ✓ I'd better take my shoes off.



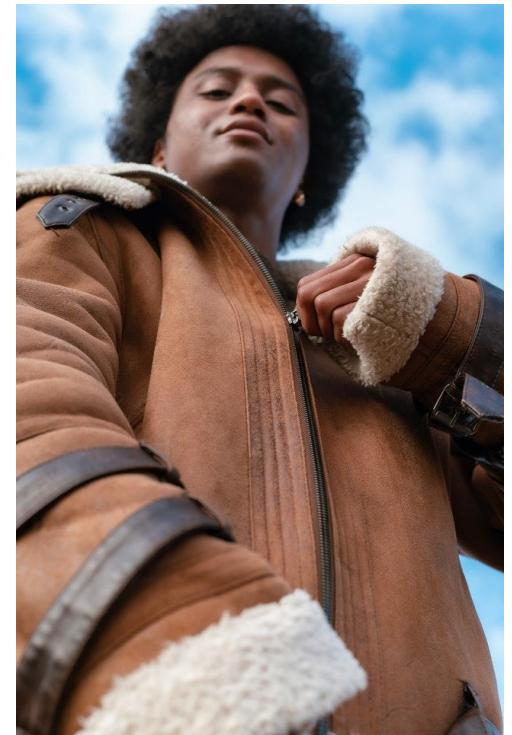
dress up – to put on clothes, especially smart or formal clothes

They dressed up and went to the party.



dress down – to put on informal or casual clothes

Sue dressed down in old jeans and a white t-shirt.



zip up – to close a zipper

**You had better zip up your jacket.
It's cold outside!**



button up – to close with buttons

✓ I should **button up** my jacket.

✓ He **buttoned up** his shirt.

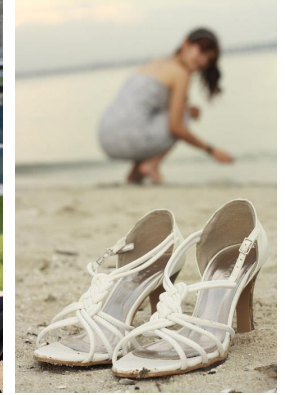
